Yellow Vetch Rediscovered at the Chasms

First recorded on the Island in 1902, but because of its cliffside habitat it has only been intermittently recorded since. Yellow vetch (Vicia lutea) was re-found in 2023 at the Manx National Heritage owned Chasms. Yellow vetch can form longlasting populations in the right habitat. The Chasms population appears unchanged in 115 years. It requires land with inherent long-term instability to create the open conditions needed for this annual to germinate.

The site visit to the Chasms population in 2023 was near the end of a spell of drought and one feature of the species was evident; when all the other species were dormant, due to drought, the yellow vetch was still actively growing. It was also clear that vetch had been selectively grazed upon by the feral sheep, removing all fresh growing tips and flowers. It is expected that the plant will re-sprout to flower again.

The Mermaid of Gob-ny-Ooyl inspires new Element Isle Range

According to Manx folklore, Bulgham Bay on the east coast of the Island was home to the Mermaid of Gob-ny-Ooyl. Legend has it that the mermaid brought luck to a local fisherman and his family in exchange for apples, which she described as 'land eggs'.

As the fisherman aged, his voyages decreased, causing their luck to fade. Some years later the mermaid appeared to the fisherman's son, inquiring about his father. Upon learning this, the old man advised his son to offer her apples to restore their family's fortunes. The son's fascination for the mermaid grew, leading him to sail away to foreign seas to overcome his obsession. Before leaving, he planted an apple tree on a cliff above the mermaid's dwelling, with ripened fruit continuing to fall into the waters, preserving the family's luck during his absence. Over the years, the mermaid could often be spotted on the rocks, singing melancholic songs of lost love, carried by the wind.

This beautiful story inspired the latest range from <u>Element Isle</u>, with the necklace and earrings available at the Manx Museum and House of Manannan.

'Yn Thie Thooit' Freshly Thatched

Recently, Manx National Heritage started work on re-thatching 'Yn Thie Thooit' (the thatched house in Manx). The cottage at the Lhen is one of only 23 examples of thatched buildings remaining on the Isle of Man. The cottage came into the ownership of MNH in 1989, following a generous bequest from the late Catherine Craine Guyler, a Home Economics Teacher at Ramsey Grammar School and former chairwoman in the Isle of Man Federation of the Women's Institutes. A generous bequest, 'Yn Thie Thooit' now provides a stunning place for visitors to stay and vital income for Manx National Heritage through self-catering accommodation. <u>Book a stay here</u>.
